- Disadvantages (judicial profiling, uncertainty, stunted jurisprudence)

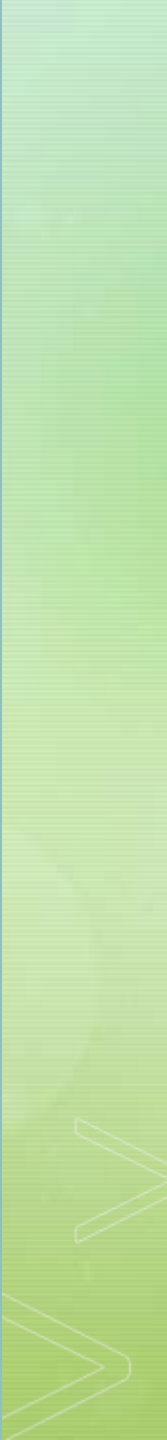

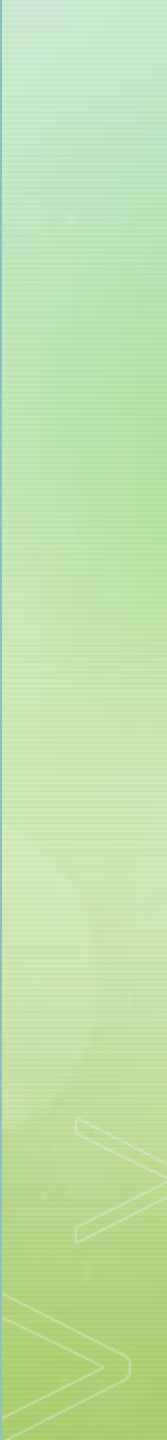


THE CONTENT

THE STRATEGY

- Let the Pleadings speak for themselves (Petitioner's case/Respondent's answer) (Pillars)
- Be in charge of Issue identification from the beginning
- Admit evidence where you must; decline evidence where you ought (navigate carefully)
- At the hearing; interrogate counsel intelligently on behalf of the electorate
- Deliver a short version which makes the detailed version almost a luxury
