RESOLUTIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The Judiciary should develop clear SJ 4 guidelines to support PWD; and also create accessible court environments in terms of information, physical access, flexibility in court scheduling, to adapt to the needs of disabled/vulnerable persons.

5 All Judicial officers should, in the execution of their work, guard against major trouble spots such as grant of exparte orders, issuance of production warrants, absenteeism and laziness.

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RESOLUTIONS/ RECOMMENDATIONS

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6 Recommendations made at previous Sec to the Conferences should be reviewed at subsequent fora (conferences) for monitoring and evaluation purposes. Sec to the conference organizing committee

Judicial officers should embrace and observe provisions of The Uganda Code of Judicial conduct as a way of redeeming public trust, respect and confidence in the Judiciary.

The judiciary administration and JSI should ensure that judicial officers are trained in the new judiciary reforms and all new and developing laws including cyber laws to effectively handle e-related disputes.

RESOLUTIONS/ RECOMMENDATIONS

⁹ Child related applications should be handled with careful scrutiny bearing in mind that each case presents peculiar facts and being wary of rampant cases of child trafficking.

¹⁰ Judicial officers should submit honest and prudent accountabilities to minimize audit queries.

¹¹ The Judiciary administration should equally and equitably distribute the resource envelop between the upper bench and the lower bench, giving priority to inputs that directly affect the core functions of the Judiciary.

RESOLUTIONS/ RECOMMENDATIONS

^{12.} To avoid disparity and discrimination across the bench, The Salaries & Allowances (specified Officers) Act CAP 291 should be amended to include magistrates.

^{13.} For transparency purposes, the deliberations of the finance committee should be published on the intranet.
